




What Are Some Key Themes?

Luke 5:4-8 (NKJV)

⁴When He had stopped speaking, He said to Simon, “**Launch out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch.**” ⁵But Simon answered and said to Him, “Master, we have toiled all night and caught nothing; nevertheless, at Your word I will let down the net.” ⁶And when they had done this, they caught a great number of fish, and their net was breaking. ⁷So they signaled to *their* partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both the boats, so that they began to sink. ⁸When Simon Peter saw *it*, he fell down at Jesus’ knees, saying, “Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord!”

What Are Some Key Themes?

- ❖ Action vs. Hearing:

Wisdom lies not in hearing, but in doing.

- ❖ The Foundation:

The “rock” signifies obedience—integrating Jesus’ teachings into daily life.

- ❖ The Storm:

Storms represent life's trials and final judgment, testing each person's foundation.

- ❖ Stability and Ruin:

A life built on obedience stands firm; one built on hearing alone collapses.

Core Lessons Learned

- ❖ **Empty Confession vs. Obedience.**
- ❖ **Hearing is not enough; you must act.**
- ❖ **Digging deep is essential for stability.**
- ❖ **Storms are unavoidable for everyone.**
- ❖ **The "shaky" foundation only fails when tested.**
- ❖ **Disobedience leads to "great ruin."**
