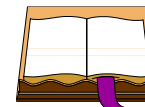

Where Is Your Faith?

Luke 8:25 (KJV) states, "And he said unto them, Where is your faith? And they being afraid wondered, saying one to another, What manner of man is this! for he commandeth even the winds and water, and they obey him." This verse, uttered by Jesus during a stormy night on the Sea of Galilee, challenges us to reflect deeply on our faith amidst trials and tribulations.

The backdrop of this scripture is both dramatic and relatable. The disciples, who have been following Jesus and witnessing His miraculous works, find themselves caught in a tempestuous storm, terrified and desperate for safety. It is here in this moment of fear that Jesus questions them, "Where is your faith?" This question reverberates through time and resonates with each one of us when we find ourselves in the midst of our own storms in life.

To truly grasp the weight of Christ's question, we must understand the disciples' previous experiences. They have seen Jesus heal the sick, cast out demons, and perform miracles that defy logic. Yet, when faced with the immediate danger of nature's fury, their trust wavers. How striking it is that our human nature often leads us to doubt in moments of crisis, despite having witnessed the faithfulness of God in the past. In our lives, we too may have experienced moments where the winds of adversity blow fiercely against us, and we question not only our circumstances but also our faith.

This scripture invites us to ask ourselves: where do we place our faith in times of trouble? Is our faith anchored in the transient things of this world, or is it firmly secured in the eternal nature of our Lord? The disciples were tempted to panic in the storm; many of us find ourselves in similar situations today, frightened by challenges in our health, relationships, finances, or even our spiritual journeys. In these turbulent moments, we may feel helpless, but Jesus is asking us to shift our focus from the storm to Him.

When Jesus asks, "Where is your faith?" He is not merely questioning the disciples about their belief but is also inviting them—and us—to a deeper understanding of His power. The latter part of the verse reflects the awe the disciples have as they realize the authority of Christ. They cry out, "What manner of man is this!" In recognizing the divinity of Christ, they begin to grasp that He is more than just a teacher or a miracle worker; He is the Lord of all creation, the One who commands even the winds and waters. **(Continue page 4)**
